## Fur & Feather Report – Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> September

### Fur & Feather

The biggest mid-month sale to date, with another fully booked shed. Numbers and trade saw an all time high.

**Sundries** continue to grow with entries from fox traps, poultry feeders to wood saws and camouflage netting.

**Hatching Eggs** saw a surprising entry for the time of year with trays of turkey eggs, hen eggs and guinea fowl.

**Caged Birds** saw a record entry with 56 lots forward seeing Love Birds to £50, Zebra finches at £25 and Canaries at £36.

**Fur** - Rabbits and guinea pigs saw every pen booked, with extras in boxes seeing 136 on sale for the day. New Zealand does topped to a mighty £42 with Rex does at £32 and mated sows at £20. Ferrets saw a steady away sale with pairs of Polecats at £28.

**Feather** - In the cages something for every buyer of all scopes, Mandarins topped out at £30 per bird alongside Carolinas at the same money. Golden Pheasants saw £22 per bird. Serama trios saw the best reach £30 with much interest. Peafowl chicks drew the crowds with the finest birds at £25 per bird, Chinese geese saw a smart entry with trios selling to £25 per bird. Fantail pigeons met demand at £1.50. On the commercial side older laying hens regularly sold to £1.50 with cockerels up to £2.50.
