The Market Report

DECEMBER PONDERINGS

Grant Schemes & Funding Opportunities

The Rural Payments Agency (RPA) have launched the Slurry Infrastructure Grant, to provide help towards farm businesses upgrading their on-farm slurry storage. The grant is to fund works which will upgrade the Slurry Storage System to provide up to 6 months storage for the current demands of the farm business. Grants from £25,000 up to £250,000 are available based upon fixed contributions. Payments are made in arrears once you have completed the works. The grant is open from 6 December 2022 to 31 January 2023. Applications are via a two-stage approach with the initial application to assess your eligibility. Examples of the funding available:

- above-ground steel slurry stores £31.50 per m³
- precast circular concrete slurry stores £26.17 per m³
- earth bank lagoons without synthetic liner £10.08 per m³
- earth bank lagoons with synthetic liner £18.22 per m³
- Payments for concrete panel stores; slurry bags; pipes, pumps, reception pits, agitators and safety equipment.

As Basic Payments reduce and potentially leave a void within farm incomes, do consider a Countryside Stewardship agreement (if you haven't already). Applications will open again in early Spring. This will be the last opportunity to apply for Countryside Stewardship, as it will be replaced by Environmental Land

Management Scheme (ELMS). Please contact a member of the Agricultural team if you would like to discuss the options and possible payments that would be available for your farm.

ELMS is still evolving and we await details of the funding opportunities that will be available. The Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) was launched earlier this year as part of ELMS. SFI agreements last for 3 years and have the flexibility to be amended every 12 months in terms of increasing the level of standards or adding additional land. There are three standards (options): the arable and horticultural soils; grassland soils; moorland and rough grazing. Payment rates range from £22 - £58 per hectare dependant on the standard and level selected. If you would like to find out more or make an application, please contact Rob Russell.

FARM ASSURANCE ACCREDITATION & SUSTAINABLE FARMING INCENTIVE

For those that are Farm Assured or looking to go Farm Assured, in order to gain the accreditation, all future Farm Assurance inspections will require a Soil Management Plan for each individual field. In order to undertake a Soil Management Plan, you need:

- field identification;
- the characteristics of the field and soil;
- whether the field is prone to soil erosion;
- management issues, (which might include matters such as compaction);
- management proposals to reduce the risk such as establishing grass buffer strips; and
- note any soil issues that arise during the year final review, such as run-off or erosion.

The link that this new requirement for the Farm Assurance has with the Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) is that under the Sustainable Farming Incentive Soil Standards, it is also a requirement to have a Soil Management Plan. For those that are thinking about dipping their toe into the Sustainable Farming Incentive, it means that by complying with your obligations under Farm Assurance you will already be undertaking some of the measures that are needed to fulfil the SFI, and overall reducing the workload to be eligible for the SFI.


