Trade eases again this week. Meat and weight saw premiums. A better than expected trade with a quality show of lambs forward. SQQ 293.11. WH Tanner & Son topped with 316p/kg and CJ White saw the best overall at £156.

Highlights - JR Smith & Son saw the best for the light lambs with Texels at 39kgs selling to £118.50, their 44.5kgs followed suit at £130 and 42kgs to £126. SGC Hill saw a best end run of fed Continental lambs with 45kgs to £140 and 49kgs to £150. WH Tanner & Son topped with smart Texel crosses at 48kgs selling to £151.50. CJ White topped overall at £156 for 56kg Texel mules and 52kgs to £151.

R&M Arrowsmith were close behind with a smart draw of meated Suffolks at £175 and smaller frame Texel crosses to £158.50, their mules topped the day at £148.50 for meat with big framed leaner sorts to £133.50. George Thompson Farms topped their Lleyns to £166.50 with leaner sorts to £149. All part meat ewes sold above £123. Feeders were up to £95. Chanciest sorts were low £50s for native bred things.

REPORT FOR SATURDAY 6TH SEPTEMBER

Store & Breeding Cattle - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

C Harrell saw their Dexter cows at 4 years old with heifer calves at foot sell to £1150. T Prowse topped the cow section seeing big framed meat Limousin at 33 months sell to £2460. R Munns saw their Hereford cows at 11 years to £1520.

Charles Hopperton continued to draw strong framed steers with Limousins at 19 months selling to £2400 and Angus at 20 months selling to £2310, £2290, £2100 and £2180. Newlands Farm followed on again this week with another draw of Angus steers topping to £1190 for 16 months and £1500 for heifers at the same mark 18 month Angus heifers sold to £1220. Holstein and Friesian steers saw a strong trade at 28 months selling to £1620, and £1480 for 24 months. GB Sear & Sons topped their blue heifers at 24 months to £1250. A Cox saw their 5 months stirks sell well for the season at £615 for Angus heifers and Limousin bulls to £580.

789 Store Sheep - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

Store Lambs - averages look easier on the week with a majority showing of later born lambs, a trying trade throughout even for the uniform runs forward. All in average £82.71. I Birden topped the day with best end Dutch spotted ram lambs selling to £150. NP & MJ Russell saw a smart show of big frame part meat lambs forward with Texels to £124.50 and £115. Webb Hatherley saw a similar show of Texel lambs in forward condition but not finished reaching £120.50, £114, £107.50, £105, £96.50 and £95. M Holyland continued their draw of Texel crosses topping to £106 and £98.50. CD Hughes penned a run of Texel crosses topping to £89 and Suffolk crosses to £82. RF Davy had another uniform run of Texel crosses selling to £84 for several pens. Healthy midterm lambs sold in the mid £80'. Long term well bred lambs sold in the £70s native bred chancy sorts sold in the £50s.

Feeding Ewes - true feeders were harder sold this week with buyers looking for shorter term hopper types ewes owing to the grass shortage. Averaging £94.38. NP & MJ Russell topped with Texel ewes to £167 for big meat. B Painter topped the rams with Suffolks to £158. D Racey & Sons saw a flyer for Cheviot ewes at £156 for meat with mules to £140. All meat sold over £115. Big framed lean ewes were £103 plus. Native bred types were £60 to £75. Herdwick rams with meat sold to £79.

Breeders - E Poulton saw a smart show of Easycare theaves ran dry and full shedders to £155. CL Fraser & Son continued their flock dispersal with Texel mule full mouth ewes selling to £138, £133, £133 and £120.

A few more than expected, the trade of the day went to P Timmins for their small Saddleback barrow weaners at £50. White boar pigs to £101 from £99, with their black counterparts to £50. Gilts £71. Older Kune Kune boars from A Pittom £12.

Every breed, shape and size of goat on offer with the top honours going to S Shah for his Boar billy to £225, Toggenburg wethers from the same home to £95. LM Anderson had a flyer with their 4 year old Pygmy nanny which had been running with the billy to £200. WE Cook Farmers Ltd had a run of smart Boer nannies topping at £150 from £148. P Timmins sold their birth notified Golden Guernsey nanny kids to £120 and a billy kid to £100. Pygmy nanny kids from R Wilkinson to £125 with his billies to £52. Plenty of Pygmy billies on offer from £30 to £100. Cross bred goats £50 to £100 depending on size.


