The Market Report

Professional Ponderings - July 2025

The Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) system underwent a major overall recently, with the introduction of RdSAP 10. The changes are the most significant in over a decade and should improve the accuracy of EPC's, helping homeowners and tenants alike make more informed decisions on energy efficiency.

The earlier Reduced Data Standard Assessment Procedure (RdSAP) was the method used for producing EPC's in existing dwellings. The ratings were based on several assumptions about how buildings were constructed and occupied. The new version introduced in June 2025 (RdSAP 10) incorporates new data inputting, revised assumptions and structural changes designed to make energy ratings more accurate. Therefore, Energy assessors should now collect and record more specific information about each property, including such information as types of glazing, home improvements and heating efficiency.

Moving forward, Landlords are being recommended to gather and provide evidence about energy improvements that have taken place before a new EPC assessment is carried out, especially for new or replaced insulation, heating improvements and new double glazing as EPC ratings could fall unless such evidence is provided.

The requirement for more detailed assessments may raise the cost of producing an EPC, and whilst Propertymark welcomes improvements to the current system, they

will continue to push for clear guidance and support for landlords and agents as they work through the changes and also push for funding to help with the cost of improvements, particularly for small landlords.

Finally, The Renters' Rights Bill completed its Lords Committee Stage in mid-May. Following this, it will move to the Report Stage and Third Reading in the House of Lords, before any final consideration of amendments. Royal Assent for the Bill is expected to take place in the Autumn before a commencement date can be announced. Propertymark has continued to push for amendments throughout the different stages of the proposed legislation.

As an active member of Propertymark Bletsoes are kept abreast with full details of any proposed legislation put forward by the UK Government, which includes EPC changes and the progress of the Renters' Rights Bill, and this information will be made readily available to our landlords. Store & Breeding Cattle

A decent seasonal show of cattle with a strong trade throughout, Greensons Limousins topped the day with a Pedigree Limousin 15 month old bull selling to £3950. R Munns topped the cows with a 30 months Angus selling to £1010, the same home saw a strong trade with well grown Angus steers seeing highs of £1360 for 18 months with followers at the same age to £1350; AC Downing saw another entry of British Blue steers at 27 months top to £1200; R Jones & Son penned a smart show of Bazadaise heifers at 14 months selling to £1200 with followers to £1140 and £1050; JF Fountain & Son saw Charolais bulls with potential to £1460 at 14 months with followers to £1070 and 9 months to £860; J Cantillon topped their Angus bulls at 16 months to £750.

Calves

A surprise entry this week with JE Parsons seeing their well grown 27 day old Simmental heifers to £520.

Pigs

Quality draws with a strong trade throughout. PA Woodward topped with best end Pietrain pigs at 12 weeks selling to £78 with crosses from the same home at £76 and £74; C Pettitt topped with their Hampshire stores to £60 for the gilts and £40 for the boars; N & E Le Count sold their Tamworth boars to £40.

Goats

All shapes, sizes and ages forward with T Buck topping the day at £280 for in-kid Pygmies and in-kid Angoras to £180; J & E Clegg penned Pedigree Anglo Nubian nannies selling to £225 with their wethers to £165; B Cushion saw their Pygmies with kids at foot top to £130 a life, with twins at foot selling to £360 an outfit. Pygmy billy trade eased, selling between £50 and £78.

321 Store & Breeding Sheep

Store Lambs - a smart showing forward with the best end shown to date, seeing a majority of Texel crosses forward averaging £96.59. EC Hartop topped the day with big framed Texel crosses to £121 with followers at £115.50 and £107.50; WF Knight & Son penned their usual stamp of Continental lambs with the first time selling stores drawing the crowd, their top end sold to £115.50, £107.50, £99.50 and £99; C Bull topped their lambs with Dutch Spotted lambs at £106; S Handy penned a smart show of small frame but best shape Beltex crosses seeing lambs to £100 and £85.

Store Hoggs - mid frame meat held the trade seeing an all in average of £101.05. Feeding Ewes - another stand on trade seeing a rise in the cull trade bolstering the feeders, averaging £91.91. S Goodship topped with best meat heavy Charollais crosses to £185; C Bull saw their smart shape small frame Texel ewes to £147; P Childs topped the rams with Grey Faced Dartmoors to £133; K Beck saw their Valais rams to £127. All mid frame meat ewes sold above £93 with native types at £62 and £77.
