In the Cattle section, the Champion and Reserve Champion animals were shown by Will and Tash Burden of W R B Farming, topping at £2,159.40. The Champion sold to W H Thomas Farm Shop of Ecton. In our NEW Calf class, sixteen calves were entered seeing WJ Robinson taking 1st place with one of his British Blue heifers. In the Sheep section, Ann Wilson won both the Champion and Reserve Champion Pen of Sheep with her Rouge lambs which sold to £250. In the Pig section, the Champion pig from Mr P Wilderspin sold for £200 to Joseph Morris Butchers.

Bedford Livestock Show Society - Michaelmas Show Saturday 23rd September 2023

REPORT FOR THURSDAY 30TH NOVEMBER

Prime Lambs

Another level trade with lighter lambs having a lift, meat is still the only way of selling to premiums prices. Lambs under 40kgs are still hard sold. SQQ 252.48p/kg. Guilford & Sons topped the pence per kilo with 40kg Texels to 171p/kg; C Stancombe topped the day overall with a 63kg Texel Mule lamb at £150, the rest of their run sold extremely well with a best meat well fed lambs seeing 52kgs to £130 and 45kgs to £117.

Highlights - AJ Geary saw a smart showing of Texels at 44kgs selling to £115 with WRB Farming and their Romney crosses selling to £109 for 43kgs; W Veal saw another best meat run of Texel crosses to £125 for 49kgs.

Cull Ewes & Rams

Trade remains constant with meat heavy ewes selling well, a bigger yarding of feeders forward that showed in the average at £65.82. AJ Geary topped the day at £130 for best meat Suffolk ewes, with Little Oxendon topping to £110 for a smart show of meated Suffolks; J Woodbridge & M Wallis saw the trade of the day with big frame lean meat Texel cross ewes reaching £104; A Hodson topped with a Blue Texel ram to £100 and good meat Mule ewes to £76. Lean meat types were in the £70's with feeders between £30 and £55 depending on breeding.

SHEEP VENDORS

New Veterinary Attestation rule for farmers to be introduced on 13th December 2023.

Action Needed Now.....

What's changing?

Changes in legislation, as from 13th December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of the new rule is to comply with EU export requirements to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm biosecurity.

Why is this changing?

The Statutory Health Attestation is required from the 13 December 2023 to certify exports of POAO (Products of Animal Origin) to the EU. The EHCs (Export Health Certificates) require that the animals' farm of origin has undergone regular visits by a veterinary surgeon.

What do producers need to do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place. The veterinary attestation template can be found here: <u>veterinary attestation template</u>. This should be signed and completed by the farm vet.

Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12month period and can be combined with any other routine veterinary visit, including government supported initiatives such as the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway in England.

Farmers and vets must keep a copy of their completed declarations and the "unique reference number" created, for their records and to provide to their livestock auction market or meat processor.

Farms that are part of qualifying assurance schemes do not need to complete the veterinary declaration. Membership of these farm assurance schemes is accepted as evidence that a premises of origin meets the requirement for regular health visits from a vet.

The qualifying schemes are:

- Annual health and welfare review (England only)
- Quality Meat Scotland (QMS)
- Farm Assured Welsh Livestock Beef and Lamb Scheme (FAWL) (Welsh Lamb and Beef Producers Ltd (WLBP))
- Red Tractor

Prime, Store & Breeding Sheep

A fantastic day with the Thrapston Fat Stock Show, seeing 291 Prime Lambs including the show and 223 Store Sheep. The day was topped by Miss AK Wilson and her Rouge lambs with the overall Champion of the day at 61.5kgs selling to £250 or 407p/kg, the standard remained the same with the same vendor winning the Reserve Champion for more Rouge lambs at 57kgs and selling to £190 or 333p/kg.

After the Show the sale of all the Show lambs and commercial lambs saw a tremendous trade with an all in average SQQ at 291.9p/kg. F & SM Stamper topped the lightest lambs of the day with 38.5kg Beltex selling to £118 and 45kgs to £145, only to be out done by a single commercial lamb at 52kgs selling to £186; AJ Geary saw a best end showing of Beltex lambs with 38kg selling to £105 and 45kgs of the same stamp to £146; JB Elkington penned a sterling run of best meat Continentals with 37.5kg lambs to £113 and 45kgs to £141; SJ Hubbard topped the weight side of the day with 50kg Beltex crosses to £150 and 54.5kgs to £158; CW Webb & Partners saw a best end show of meat lambs with Texel crosses at 50kgs flying to £152, and topping the Suffolks for the day with 59kg big framed lambs topping at £152.

Store Lambs - A tougher day overall in this section with longer term lambs harder to place, hopper types are still holding the trade but not quite as sharp as before. All in average £68.92. WG Childs & Sons topped the day overall with best end Charollais lambs selling to £95 with similar framed types at £87; C Major topped their run of smart Texels at £95 with their second pen at £85; Reynolds Farmers saw the best of the Suffolks with a smart headed longer term show selling to £87. The majority of Continental bred big frame lambs were seen at £80 plus with longer term lambs in the high £60's, smallest chancy lambs were seen sub £40.

Feeding Ewes - A continuing trend with frames and part meat holding the trade, all in average £52.51. P Zwetsloot topped the day with Charollais ewes to £114 for best shape; S Lee saw a high of £95 for Continental thick ewes; J Davis topped the native breeds with Herdwick ewes to £62. Mid frame part meat were seen in the high £70's, smaller frame native types were sold at around £59.




