#### **REPORT FOR THURSDAY 17TH JULY**

#### 1084 Prime Lambs

Bumper show of the year with all grades welcomed and sold at Thrapston. Over 44kgs continue to see the demand and finish on all weights is key. Over 44kgs sold around 340p/kg with lighter lambs at 320p/kg. Lean grass fed lambs still sold around 290p/kg to 300p/kg. SQQ 339.36p/kg. Raveley Fen Farms topped at 386p/kg and Stimson Co Ltd topped overall at £206.

Highlights - Raveley Fen Farms penned a real run of cream seeing their Charollais and Beltex crosses to £166 or 386p for 43kgs with 45kgs to £160, three pens sold to £158 for 43.5kgs; Stimson Co Ltd topped the day overall at £206 for the best example of April born lambs at 56kgs for Charollais, their followers saw 45kg Texels to £166 for the same stamp; Hyde Lane Farms continued their draw with best meat Texels at 45kgs selling to £159 and 48.5kgs to £177; Ulmus Farm Ltd saw their usual stamp forward with Texels at 49kgs selling to £179 and 61kgs to £200; SGC Hill penned best fed run of Suffolk Charollais with highs at 52kgs to £179, 49.5kgs to £178 and 50kgs to £174; JTG & PA Harris also surpassed the £200 mark with 62kgs Charollais crosses.

#### **REPORT FOR SATURDAY 19TH JULY**

#### **Pigs - Auctioneer Richard Spendlove**

White pigs from N Gabriel topped at £68 for a smart gilt with a similar sized boar £60, small stores sold to £21 from £15.

#### **Calves - Auctioneer Richard Spendlove**

A fantastic trade throughout for the quality calves on offer. Newlands Farm topped the day with their 15 day old Charolais heifer at £625 with their bull just behind at £605 and a named sire Angus at £410; A nice run of sought after British Blue calves from Messrs JEG James saw heifers top at £600 from £590 with their bulls at £495 from £485; Dairy bred calves from F H Pullin & Sons Ltd met with plenty of demand with an Ayrshire bull at £190, Holstein Friesian bulls to £190 from £180.

#### 323 Store & Breeding Sheep - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

**Store Lambs** - another cracking entry this week with the first true showing of stores from yearly vendors, with the grass situation we have had, a bigger showing of forward lambs that would usually have been sold fat. The recent rain has clearly bolstered the trade with an all in average of £95.22, shorter term hopper lambs sold to £115 plus with well grown true stores ranging from £87 to £115, breed and frame depending as usual. Native bred types and very long term were £52 to £70. A Cook topped the day with a best end showing of Charollais lambs seeing £137 and £126; AJ Geary topped their Texel Cheviots to £130 with followers at £121 and £117; D Burton penned a smart run of Texels seeing £120.50 for the most forward and £114 for longer term; Jones & Son - Manor Farm penned their usual stamp of Texel cross lambs seeing highs at £120.50, £116 and £115; D Morris saw the trade of the day with indoor Suffolk lambs selling to £116.50; J Lepper began their annual consignment of Charollais cross lambs with mid frames topping to £112, leading onto £111.50, £110.50 and £100; G Exton saw a uniform run of Charollais crosses forward selling to £95, £92 and £87 for strong potential. Longer term Cheviot lambs sold at £59 with Jacobs to £52.

Feeding Ewes - another strong trade this week with frame key to top end prices, Averaging £79.04. W Hammond topped with big frame Suffolk Texels to £166 and Continentals to £151 and £157, a run of Cheviots from the same home sold to £144 with followers at £135, £129, £120 and £115; D Morgan saw a smart run of meat with rams to £149 and Continental ewes at £138; S Haigh penned a run of draft ewes seeing the Continental crosses to £89 and mid £70's, the same home saw longest term Shetland crosses at £27. Jacobs topped at £72 with meat seeing leaner sorts to £54.

#### Store & Breeding Cattle - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

AB Spackman topped the cows with 10 years old empty Angus to £1120, the same home saw 21 month Angus heifers to £790; SS Gawthroup & Sons topped the steers with Angus Charolais at 17 months flying to £1910 for big frame thick boned cattle showing potential; DTA Tomkins had a quality show of Limousin heifers at 26 months that had calved and back empty selling to £1790 and £1700; O Garnham sold their Dexters with 22 month bulls to £340, steers at 8 months to £340 and heifers at 5 months to £250. A bigger entry of store cattle catalogued already for next week.
