Cambridge University Farm penned a majority showing with their Texel Mule lambs topping at 342p/kg for 42kgs with 44.5kgs Suffolks to £146, their heavy Charollais lambs at 56kgs topped at £150. Ulmus Farm penned their usual stamp of quality with Texels at 47kgs flying to £158.

Cartwright Farms topped the day with 311p/kg for best end Charollais hoggs at 48.5kgs, followed with 40kgs of the same stamp at £119; M Burke saw a run of smart meat Continental rams sell to £128 at 44kgs; D Sansom penned a tidy show of Texel crosses with 45kgs at £120; DB Standing saw their usual stamp of Charollais forward with 46.5kgs to £130; SF & JH Wagstaff penned a meat run of heavies with the top end at £155 for 69kg Suffolks, their Texel crosses topped at the same level for 65.5kgs.

Big framed meat ewes sold £140 plus with mid frame leaner types £127 to £138, true feeders were £100 to £116.

JEG James entered British Blue bulls and heifers which sold to £700 from £360 and a Holstein bull sold to £170.

Ewes with Lambs - another flying week with no signs of the trade weakening. A Olorenshaw topped the day with North Country Mule hoggs and single Blue Texel lambs selling to £145 a life, with their twins topping to £110 a life, or £330 an outfit; Rand Contracting saw a tremendous show of full mouth Texel ewes with strong lambs selling to £135 a life, their Suffolks with twins at the same age sold to £115 a life, Romney ewes from the same home with twins at foot topped to £306 the outfit. WV Harris & Son penned their best end full mouth Cheviot Mule ewes with well grown Charollais lambs selling to £110 a life for the doubles and their Mules with singles to £100 a life; C & SR Johnson topped their full mouth Texel crosses and singles to £102 a life followed with Mules at the same age £98 a life. Native bred types such as Jacobs sold around £65 a life.

Store Lambs - following the prime trade easing a harder week averaging £101.23. D Morgan topped the day at £124 for Charollais lambs; M Mahoney saw their Texel Mules to £120; J Cadman penned a smart run of Charollais crosses seeing highs of £109.50 for mid frame lambs with followers at £86. Longest term lambs still sold to £73.50.

Feeding Ewes - a flyer once again averaging £127.37. J & V Short topped the day at a £167 for best shape Charollais ewes with Mules to £148.50; D Morgan saw similar highs with Texel ewes to £156 and £150; J Cadman topped their run with Hampshire crosses at £146. True feeders sold around £130 for mid frame healthy ewes, native bred sorts were around £60.
