640 Sheep forward saw an uplift in prices this week at Thrapston. A slight fall in numbers around the country has seen some better prices than we had been achieving. The average prices around the country are being impacted upon with poorer quality lambs included within the overall recording.

REPORT FOR SATURDAY 25TH SEPTEMBER

Store Cattle

Smart entry forward with something for every buyer. Steers topped to £1380 from Charles Hopperton with their 21 month old British Blues. R Munns saw equal highs with Aberdeen Angus steers aged 25 months old at £1375. JTG & PA Harris topped their run with South Devon steers to £1000 at 17 months old. A Aves rang the bell in the heifers with Herefords in forward condition reaching £1290 at 22 months old. J Bottesch saw equal top end trade for their Limousins with the smartest reaching £1250. K Finch penned a sterling showing of pure South Devons in high herd status with the four 19 month olds seeing £1010.

Calves

Strongest hit the highs with JEG James topping the day at £300 for their British blue bulls at 1 month old, with their slightly younger calves seeing £250 and £220.

AG Burton (TB4) topped their entry with big framed Holstein stirks at 3 months of age reaching £165, with Aberdeen Angus heifers to £90 and Holstein Fresians at one month old topping to £65.

Store Sheep
