REPORT FOR THURSDAY 27TH NOVEMBER

438 Prime Lambs

A similar trade on the week with meat continuing key, smart export types saw clear premiums. SQQ 323.28. W Veal topped at 363p/kg and WG Childs & Son topped overall at £201.

Highlights - Guilford & Sons saw the best of the small lamb trade with 35kgs Beltex crosses to £124 or 354p/kg for 35kgs. G. Green saw their usual stamp of Texel lambs flying to £154 for 45kgs. W Veal topped with Texel lambs to 363p/kg for 41kgs. JR Smith & Son saw smart trade with Texels at 42.5kgs and 43kgs selling to £147.50. Grange Farm topped their Texels at £165 for 50kgs with 47.5kgs to £159.50. WG Childs & Son had a show stopper run with Texel and Charollais crosses to £201 for 64kgs. CJ Whitehead & Son saw the run of the day with 57kgs topping to £190 and over 60kgs selling to £184, £180 and £176.

THRAPSTON & DISTRICT FAT STOCK SHOW & SALE

A fantastic Show and Sale with entries and prices far exceeding expectations. The weather did nothing to dampen spirits or attendance with a record turn out. The day raised £2143 through charity auctions and 'guess the weight'. The first prize Christmas wreath from Matt Weston sold in the cattle ring at £230 going to the judge herself Margret Betts, followed by the first prize Christmas tipple of Sloe Gin at £150 selling to David Yeomans.

Show Cattle - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

A record entry of 52 cattle forward on the day with every section seeing strong competition. A massive thank you to Mr P Amor for judging the cattle on the day then going on to purchase both cattle and sheep in the show.

Champion of the day went to TA Lyon for their Limousin heifer at 728kgs selling to 610p/kg to B&C Kitson of Five Houses Farm Shop & Kitchen. The reserve champion saw W&J Ludgate with their Limousin heifer at 562kgs selling to 520p/kg to WH Thomas Farm Shop. Full results of the show can be seen on the prize table. All prime cattle on the day averaged 412.87p/kg. The baby beef class saw a strong entry with 14 going through the ring, FS Knight topped the section with Limousin heifers at £2380 for 8 months old.

Sheep - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

Another top end show with a real stamp of quality forward and a big thank you to the judge on the day Mr R Foster aka Frustrated Farmer. Champion lambs went to W&J Ludgate for their Beltex lambs at 43kgs selling to £250 to Mr B Burton. Reserve Champion lambs came from AJ Geary at 40.5kgs selling to the cattle judge Mr P Amor. Lambs sold to a fantastic trade with the vast majority in excess of 400p/kg. The cull ewe section saw serious highs averaging £216.58.

Store & Breeding Cattle - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

HM & NJ How saw a smart show of Hereford cows and calves forward with 10 year old pedigree cows and 7 month bull calves at foot selling to £2350. J Bottesch sold big framed British Blue cows scanned empty to £2220 with meat and shape. J Pell saw comparable highs with Aberdeen Angus cows to £1990. J Bottesch also topped the stores with Limousin steers at 22 months in forward condition. AC Downing saw their run of British Blue steers top to £1720 at 29 months, Angus steers at 24 months sold to £1160 from the same home. TP Hinch saw a strong trade for their Angus steers at 9 months with the first at £1195 and followers at £1125. J Pell saw a genuine run of 16 month Angus steers and heifers forward with the steers topping to £1000 and heifers to £840.

Store Lambs - trade sees no let up averaging £116.39. RC & JT Bailey topped the day at £145.50 for big framed Suffolk lambs. Big frame lambs sold £126 and above. Mid frame well bred lambs were £105 to £115. Long term lambs were £90's.

Feeding Ewes - another flyer this week averaging £121.56. RW Boulton topped at £184 for Lleyns with meat, RC & JT Bailey saw Continental ewes to £159 with Suffolks to £147.50. RG Chamberlain topped the mules at £145. True feeders sold £90 to £112 frame dependant.

A nice entry of quality Pigs for the Fat Stock with the Champions and 1St in Class 1 coming from Reggie Keeling for his Pietrain Gilts selling to the Judge for £330 each. The second place pigs in class 1 from Messrs Stickles Meremouth Farms Ltd reached £180. Others of note gilts from R & H Farming to £170.

A small entry of Store Pigs saw Tamworth x Gloucester Old Spot weaners from S Bowles to £60 for the gilts and £30 for boars. Small Pietrain x castrated barrows from R & H Farming to £20.

Just a few from S Bowles a Saanen x Nanny to £90, a Golden Guernsey nanny with a Pygmy x nanny kid at foot £50 a life and a Pygmy x billy to £43.

Quality throughout with the Championship being awarded to a British Blue x Bull just 17 days old shown by Sunbeam Farms selling to £750 to Messrs Collington. Not far behind was the Reserve Champion also a British Blue this time from Messrs J E G James selling to £720 to Northamptonshire Livestock Supplies. Other Blues from Messrs James £660 from £400 with their Aberdeen Angus 1st prize in the Native class making £460. F H Pullin & Sons saw their Angus calves to £370 from £250.




David Jerrams
