A lift in the trade alongside a serious standard of quality. Over 47kgs continue to be hard sold although with a slight lift. 40-46kgs saw a massive lift in the week. SQQ 338.89p/kg overall average 311.48p/kg. F & S M Stamper topped at 398p/kg and £183.

F & S M Stamper saw a flyer for the best end goods with Beltex at 45kgs selling to £180 with 46kgs to £183 or 398p/kg, with 48.5kgs to £180 and 52.5kgs to £178. C J Whitehead & Son penned and best meat run Texels selling to £158.50 for 44kgs. B Currie topped at £157 for 44.5 kgs Texel mules. C Stancombe & Son saw their Texel mules to £151.50 for 43.5kgs with 46.5kgs to £154. Raveley Fen Farms saw their best Charollais to £173.50 for 56kgs. 54kgs plus sold in the region of 270p/kg.

REPORT FOR SATURDAY 7TH FEBRUARY

Store Cattle - Auctioneer Jake Wagstaff

A Pittom started the day with a belted Galloway bull at 7 years old selling to £1500, J C Dexter followed with a Dexter bull at 16 years old selling to £500.

Croft Farms saw the younger entries forward with Friesian steers at 4 months selling to £410. Vanish Point Farm drew a pair of Hereford Freemartin heifers at 9 months selling to £920 and £800. P J Walton saw a smart draw of forward condition Hereford steers at 12 months selling to £1580 with a Hereford cross Charolais heifer at 17 months topping to £1500. Y P Genever & Daughters saw a flying run of suckler bred Angus steers at 10 months and TB4s topping to £1680 with followers at £1480, £1370 and £1300. Philipson Estates followed suit with another run of Angus at 15 - 20 months with the first pen of steers flying to £2060, heifers at slightly younger age sold to £1410. I S & N K Johnson saw the stars of the show with their annual consignment of Limousin steers and heifers at 20 - 23months, top of the day saw a £2610 with a following bunch of 5 steers to £2500 and smarter shape smaller frame to £2550. Their heifers topped to £2580 with followers to £2320 and £2280. A J Day & Son saw a comparable run of Limousin heifers at 19 - 20months smaller frame but thicker selling to £2180 and £2170.

Breeding Goats in demand saw a Boer x Nubian Nanny and her Boer x Kids from S. Shah sell for £100 a life. In kid Boers to £155 scanned with twins and £130 with singles. Boer Wethers to £142 from D L J K Hughes. Pygmies ever popular topping at £155 for a nanny from J Bardwell, Wethers from Olly Cooper £110. Others £35 to £65. J E G James topping the trade with their British Blues a smart bull 1 month 9 days selling to £650 with others £600 and heifers £500 from £480. J O Williams had a nice run of British Blues, to £530 for bulls from £425 and heifers £430 from £360. An Aberdeen Angus bull from Redgate Dairy Farm led the way for the Natives to £605 and their Holstein Friesian bull to £195, other Holsteins from A G Burton to £170 from £130.

Feeding Ewes - trade lifts on the week averaging £109.73. J Bardwell topped at £173 for a smart Blue Texel ewe, S Gawthroup saw a flyer with good frame part meat Suffolk ewes at £171 and £141. R J Garley drew quality forward seeing Continentals to £160.50 from £155. All part meat sold £125 plus. Native bred sorts sold in the £40's.

Breeding Sheep - S J Leedham saw the start of the season for ewes with lambs at foot with Charollais 6 tooth ewes and single lambs selling to £104 a life. Mowsley Hill Farm saw another consignment of Lleyn theaves forward (ran with the Lleyn ram) selling to £200. C D Hughes saw their annual draw of scanned triplets forward with Scotch mules at 6 tooth selling to £252 for several pens with the rest of the run selling to £235 for full and broken mouthed over 4 pens. W Hammond saw the trade of the day with Beulah x full and broken mouth ewes scanned with twins selling to £228 for several pens with the singles at £190 and triplets to £200.
