703 Prime Lambs

Unbelievable trade with fantastic highs! Trade jumped up once again with an SQQ of 264p/kg. On the day a better showing of lambs with farmers appreciating the stark difference and potential in price. W Hammond topped the day with a sterling show of Beltex lambs selling to 305p/kg and Yelden Growers Ltd topped to £144 in the lump.

Highlights - best end lighter weight lambs saw the best end highs this week with W Hammond topping to £116 for 38kgs and 41.5kgs to £125; SJ Hubbard also had a flyer topping to £124 for 45kgs; Hyde Lane Farms saw best end prices for best end lambs with 45kgs selling to £130; Corney & Sons saw a flying run of best meat Charollais topping with 55kgs to £140; PD Freeman also topped at £140 with 51.5kg Texel crosses; CA Stubbs saw the usual goods top to £136 for 52kgs; alongside JI Holmes with their 51kg Texel crosses at £136; R & M Arrowsmith drew the top showing of Suffolks on the day with 57kgs reaching £139.

FARM ASSURANCE ACCREDITATION & SUSTAINABLE FARMING INCENTIVE

For those that are Farm Assured or looking to go Farm Assured, in order to gain the accreditation, all future Farm Assurance inspections will require a Soil Management Plan for each individual field. In order to undertake a Soil Management Plan, you need:

- field identification;
- the characteristics of the field and soil;
- whether the field is prone to soil erosion;
- management issues, (which might include matters such as compaction);
- management proposals to reduce the risk such as establishing grass buffer strips; and
- note any soil issues that arise during the year final review, such as run-off or erosion.

The link that this new requirement for the Farm Assurance has with the Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) is that under the Sustainable Farming Incentive Soil Standards, it is also a requirement to have a Soil Management Plan. For those that are thinking about dipping their toe into the Sustainable Farming Incentive, it means that by complying with your obligations under Farm Assurance you will already be undertaking some of the measures that are needed to fulfil the SFI, and overall reducing the workload to be eligible for the SFI.
